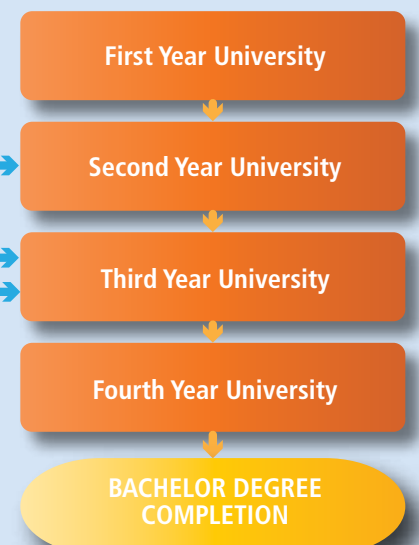


Transfer into 2nd Year University

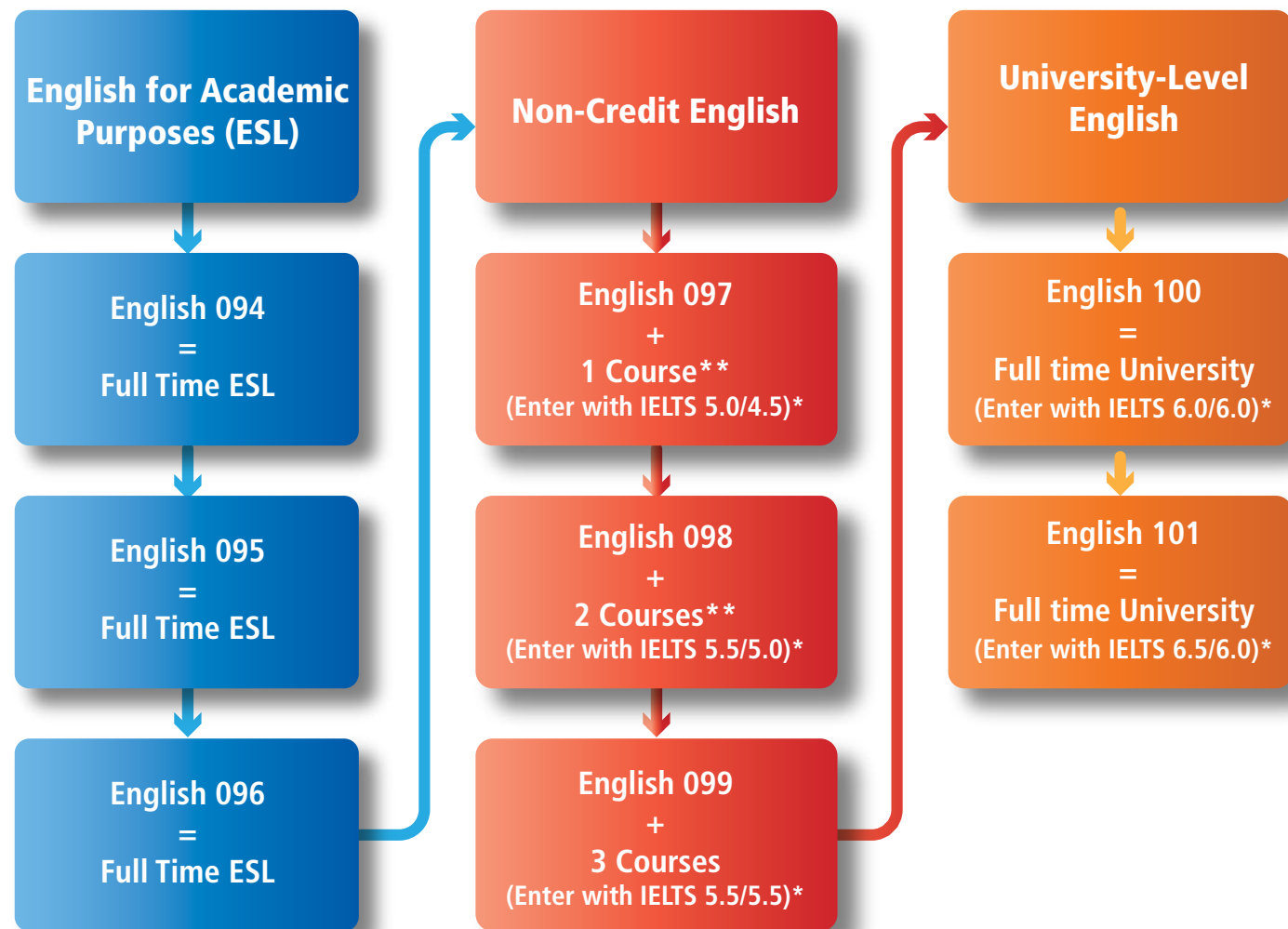
